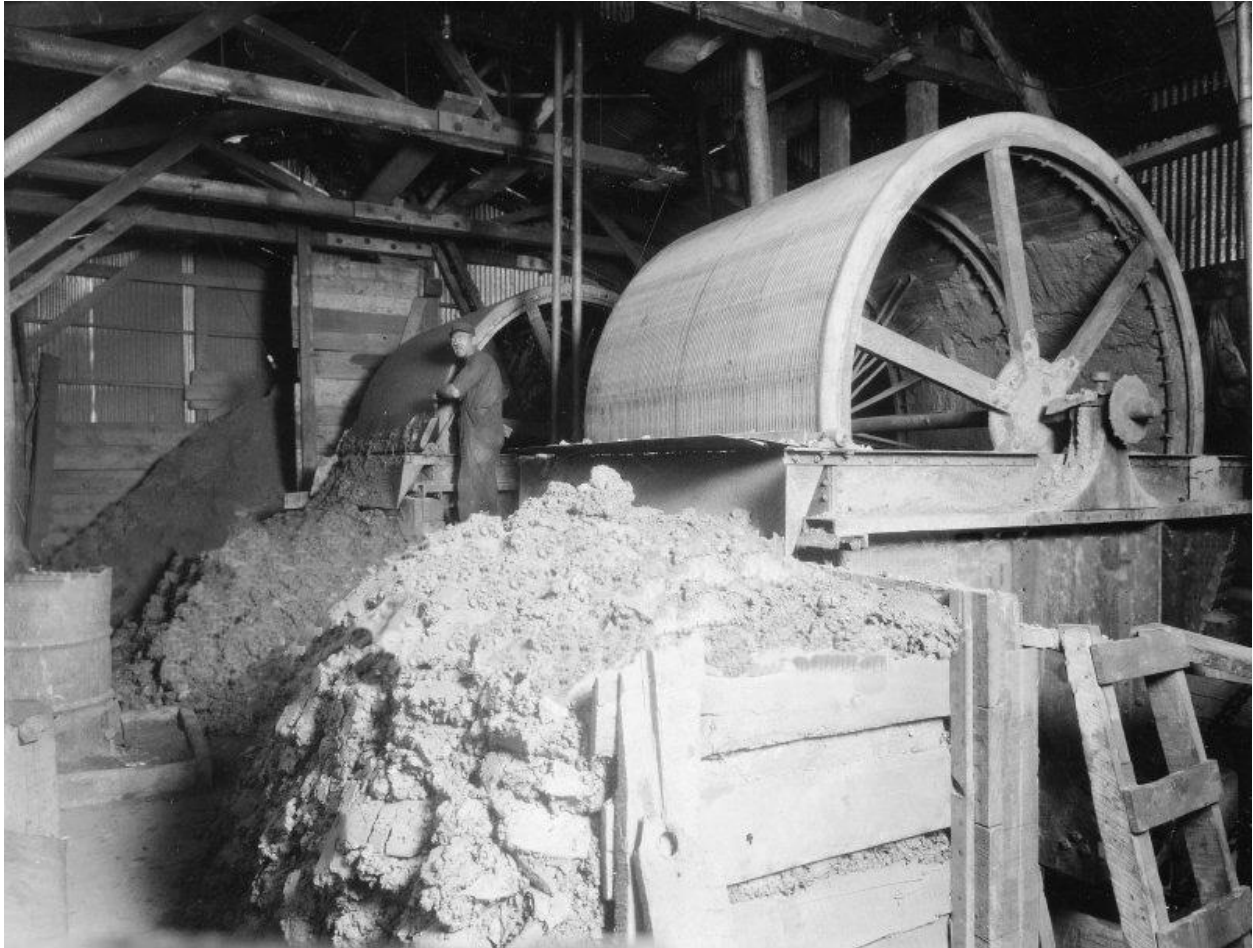


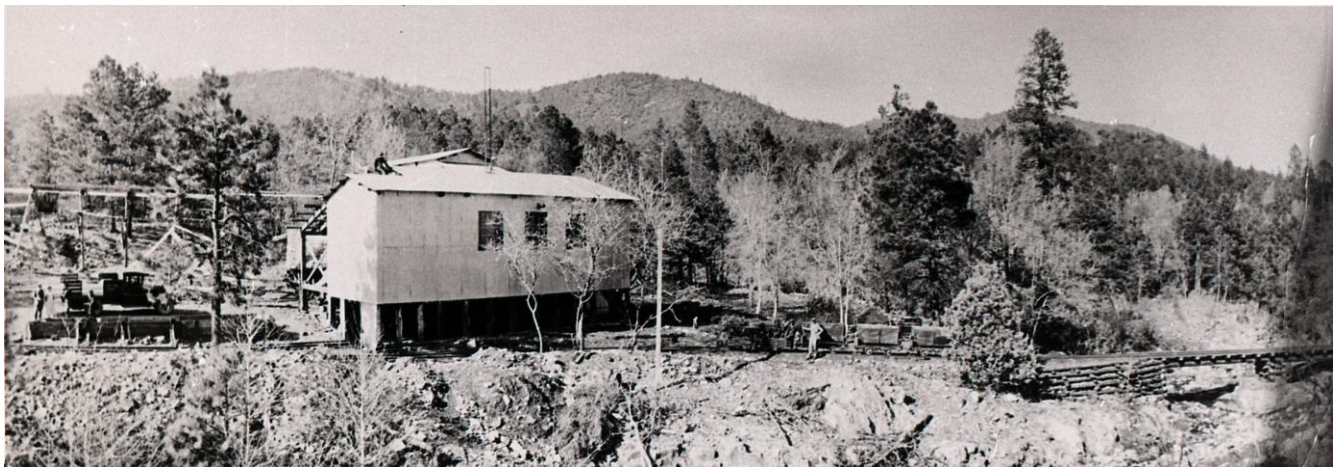
Filtering Plant

Basically, ore was crushed at the mine location where the gold and silver were removed. The remaining ore (mostly copper) was mixed with water and then piped in an eight-inch wooden pipe down Rich Gulch to the filtering plant. The concentrate was then loaded into large mesh covered wheels which were then spun to remove the water. The resultant concentrate was originally loaded onto wagons and hauled to smelters using horses. Later, a narrow-gauge railroad was used to haul the concentrate to Poland through the Poland-Walker Tunnel where it was then loaded onto railroad cars for transport to various smelters. Evidence of the train trestle can still be seen where it crossed Lynx Creek to reach the filtering plant.





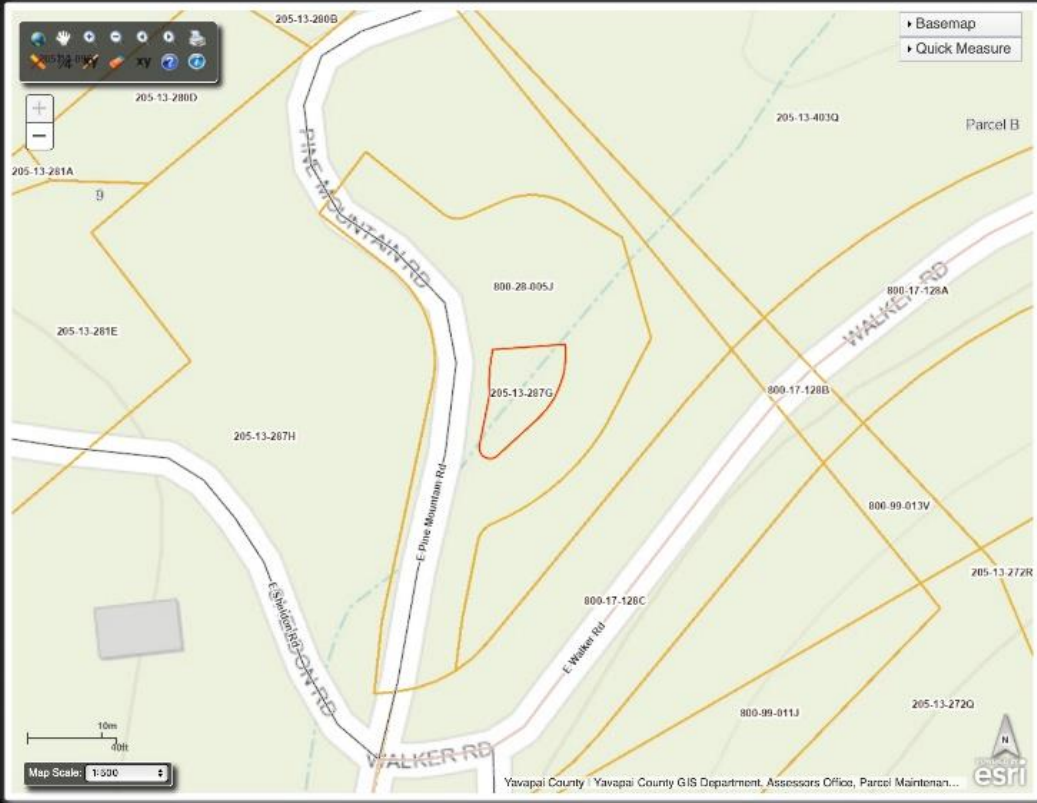
